1. Is your current au pair from an A8 country?

A3. Do you think that access to the labour market has made any difference to your experience of hosting an au pair?

Objective: to explore whether employers know about impact of accession on au pair's rights to employment, and whether they see this as relieving pressure on the "familial" relationship or whether it is regarded as time away from the household

- Does your au pair work? What does she do?
- Does your au pair want to work? What do you feel about this?
- Do you think that it's a good thing for au pairs to work outside the family? Why? Why not?
- What is the effect of au pairs working outside the family?

A4. What other effects (if any) has EU Enlargement had on your au pair's experience of life in the UK?

- do you think she's more likely to stay for longer?

A5. Do you think that EU Enlargement has had any other effects on your experiences of hosting an au pair?

Objective: to see if the change in immigration status has had an effect on conditions and on the relationship between host family and au pair

- Has your au pair become more demanding? Hours and pay?
- Has your au pair returned to their home country for a visit?
- Do you feel that your relationship with your au pair has changed? (equality)
 - More like a nanny
 - More like a family member
 - More like a friend

A6. Following EU Enlargement, would you be more or less likely to host an au pair from the New Member States, or would it make no difference?

Objective: To explore the relationship between nationality and legal status in host families' choice of au pairs.

- do you think an A8 national is more likely to stay for a longer time?
- is it less bureaucratic to host A8 nationals?
- would you prefer to stay with a nationality that you have previously hosted?

A7. Has EU Enlargement affected how you would make contact with au pairs in the future?

- Would you recruit from A8 nationals already in the UK? (no concern about immigration laws)
- Would you consider recruiting direct from A8 countries
- Does it make you more or less likely to use an agency?

A8. Has EU enlargement had the consequences (adverse or positive) that you imagined it would have in terms of your relationship with your au pair?

Thank the host family member for their time.

Explain again that the interview is completely anonymous and we are not interested in their personal details, but in order to match their interview with their previous interview we need to know their password
