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Strategic Approaches to Migrants with Irregular Status

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Immigrant Eligibility for Services in the U.S.



- Most lawfully residing immigrants must wait five years or longer to receive the major cash, nutrition, and health programs
- Undocumented immigrants: only services such as emergency medical, school lunch, community clinics, and programs necessary to protect life or safety
- > States & localities can expand or restrict access to services for immigrants

States & Localities: Inclusive Policies

- ➤ 30+ states cover lawfully residing children or pregnant women without a waiting period; 16 offer prenatal care and 6 cover children, regardless of status; some localities offer care to all residents
- ➤ 20+ states offer in-state tuition; 8+ offer financial aid to eligible students regardless of status;
- ➤ 12 states + DC offer driver's licenses to all residents; Municipal IDs issued in many cities.
- > Hundreds of localities and some states limit entanglement with federal enforcement efforts

California over Time



- Expanded access to health care and essential services for immigrants ineligible for federal programs
- Improved access to higher education and professional licenses
- > Restored access to driver's licenses
- > Strengthened workers' rights and anti-discrimination laws
- Limited local entanglement in federal immigration enforcement
- Began to address criminal justice reforms with an impact on low-income immigrants

Ongoing State and Local Advocacy

- > Limit entanglement with federal enforcement
- > Increase access to counsel
- > Protect privacy; Safe Zone policies
- > Expand access to health care & other services
- > Improve access to education and careers
- Protect workers' and tenants' rights
- > Criminal justice, civil rights, detention reforms
- > Driver's licenses, municipal IDs

Strategies



Civic Participation

- > Support & coordinate with affected communities
- > Strengthen alliances while supporting immigrant leadership
- > Build power and accountability of elected officials

Local Advocacy

- Local policies can build support for state policies, and can help shape national conversation on immigration
- > Opens opportunities even in hostile states

Communication

- Document broader benefits of inclusive policies, and harm of restrictive policies
- Send message that investing in the country's residents pays off economically, socially and politically
