Who are WSMP?

- ► The Wales Strategic Migration Partnership (WSMP) is funded by the Home Office to be an independent partnership
- Members include Local authority dispersal areas, UKVI, Welsh Government, Police, WLGA, British Red Cross, Welsh Refuge Council, elected members, City of Sanctuary
- Strategic lead, advisory and consultative role on migration in Wales
- All Wales remit engagement at UK context
- Expertise on migration (asylum, refugee resettlement, unaccompanied asylum seeking children, EU migration)

WSMP SYRIAN RESETTLEMENT TOOLKIT; building engagement locally

- Identify political and corporate leadership and named officer to take forward multi-agency discussions
- Which partners should be involved
- Which services should be scoped
- ► Links with asylum dispersal experts
- Developing a communications strategy
- Key contacts/peer support

LA Delivery Group-

- Build support for the scheme and encourage Local Authorities to participate
- All participating LAs, SRP Team, Welsh Government, WLGA, DWP, DCLG, education and health boards in Wales,
- Experience shared from established asylum dispersal areas, national specialists (Wales and UK)
- ► Initial resistance to wider narrative?

Building engagement-what works

- National leadership
- Resolving problems, help partners manage risks and make informed choices
- ► Enable all-Wales discussions/sharing info and best practice
- Honesty and transparency
- ▶ Understanding of the challenges LAs face
