



Better Together: Family, School and community partnership in urban contexts

This conference brings together teachers with academics to discuss how best to use parental engagement to enhance children's learning in contexts of increased population diversity. Urban schools must continue to adapt and respond to new and changing populations with complex histories and varying prior learning experiences. Partnerships between schools, families and communities are vital in addressing some of the challenges in securing equal achievement for all children in schools, since families are recognized as having great influence on student attendance and engagement. The conference enables teachers and researchers to share their perspectives on the opportunities and consider the challenges of engaging in such work:

- What messages can be learned from practice and research on this topic?
- What strategies work well in developing home-school cooperation?
- What can be learned from where it goes wrong?
- What implicit assumptions must be considered when engaging with this type of work?
- What can we learn from what works well, to make it work even better?

The conference will include a mix of presentations and themed participatory workshops to bring together academic perspectives with practitioner insight in a lively forum. It aims to inform teachers on how best they can use parental involvement to improve children's attainment in contexts of urban population diversity, debate issues relating to these topics, advance practice, facilitate networking among those working on this topic and identify gaps in research.
