# **Guidance for Municipalities on Migrants with Irregular Status**

Document prepared by Dr Sarah Spencer CBE Centre on Migration, Policy and Society University of Oxford

Reflecting the interest that the Current Affairs Committee has taken in refugees' and migrants' access to essential services, and more broadly in the role of local and regional authorities in relation to migration (as in <u>Recommendation 394 (2017)</u>, we draw attention to new Guidance for municipalities on managing the challenges posed by the presence of migrants with irregular immigration status ('undocumented').

The City Initiative on Migrants with Irregular Status (C-MISE), a Working Group of 11 cities chaired by Utrecht and facilitated by the University of Oxford, has published the first Guidance for Municipalities on how to respond to the presence of migrants with irregular status (https://www.compas.ox.ac.uk/2019/migrants-with-irregular-status-in-europe-guidance-for-municipalities), and an accompanying short-video documentary: "*Migrants with Irregular Status: How to respond?*" available at: https://youtu.be/bdohxNnIN-M.

The Guidance sets out the reasons why municipalities facilitate access to services, and provides practical information on current practices across Europe in areas such as legal advice, healthcare, education and shelter. It provides advice on handling personal data (referring to <u>ECRE's General</u> <u>Policy Recommendation 16</u> on non-discrimination against irregular migrants) and on providing services with or through NGOs.

An executive summary is translated into Greek, Spanish, French and Italian, with further languages forthcoming.
