Shelter and Care



- Choice on Local Level
 - Providing Structural Shelter
 - → Public Order and Safety
 - → Human Rights commitment
 - Providing shelter informally
 - → Reduction of Symptoms
 - → Incidental
 - The street and illegality is never a solution
 - **→** Legalisation
 - → Reconnection

On the Contrary

- Article 3 European Convention on Human Rights
- EU Return Directive, article 3 (def), Preambule 12, article 9.2
- EU Directive equivalent to ECSR case?
- Support by recent Jurisdiction of the High Court
- WMO cases based on Human Rights Conventions



Strategic impact for local policy makers

- Win your case by losing it:
 - Harsh refusals in legal procedures
 - Describe undocumented migrant as even more vulnerable
 - Use all your knowledge of human right treaties/conventions
 - Create jurisprudence that will support your (hidden) agenda
 - Try convince other cities not to lose themselves in senseless technical procedures (e.g. forms not filled in correctly etc)
 - Conference of European Churches filed complaint ECSR
 - Risk of overinclusion of all undocumented migrants?



Eurocities Alliance?

- Decision ECSR public on november 10th 2014
- Lobby by the Netherlands Committee of ministers EU member states against European Social Charter as applicable to undocumented migrants (including Families?)
- Strong advise by Eurocities to plead for shelter food and clothes for asylumseekers at least (conform EU Directive)
