The programme, *British Council Researcher Links*, provides opportunities for Early Career Researchers from the UK and internationally to interact and learn from each other and explore opportunities for building long-lasting research collaborations.

As part of this programme, we are now recruiting Early Career Researchers to participate in the workshop: *Migration and Urban Transformations in Latin America and the UK*.

The workshop will provide a unique opportunity for sharing research expertise and networking. During the workshop, Early Career Researchers will have the opportunity to present their research in the form of a short oral presentation and discuss this with established researchers from the UK and partner countries. There will be a focus on building up links for future collaborations and participants selected on the basis of their research potential and ability to build longer term links.

The **British Council** and **FAP-DF** will cover the costs related to the participation to the workshop, including: travel (both international and local), accommodation and meals. Costs for visas and travel insurance will be covered; however, participants will be responsible for making all the necessary arrangements. The British Council accepts no responsibility for any problems which may occur when the participants are in-country.

Application Deadline:

The application form (see below) must be completed in full and submitted by 31 March 2018

Eligibility Criteria:

- Application forms (see below) must be completed in full and submitted via email to: workshopbrasilia2018@gmail.com
- Application must be submitted before the above deadline
- Participants must be Early Career Researchers: this is defined as holding a PhD (or having equivalent research experience; workshop organisers define the

prerequisites according to field of research / discipline) and having up to 10 years post-PhD research experience. They are equivalent to the 'Recognised Researcher' and sometimes 'Experienced Researcher' categories in the EU framework for researchers' careers

- Participants must have a research or academic position (a permanent post, research contract, or fellowship *etc.*) at a recognised research institution in either the UK or in
- Please note that participants are expected to attend all sessions of the workshop.

Quality Assessment

- Experience and relevance of the applicant's research area to the workshop
- Motivation and contribution to the aims of the workshop
- Description of the long term impact expected through the participation in the workshop
- Ability to disseminate workshop's outcomes

Selection Procedure:

- Eligibility check
- Quality assessment

Notification of results:

Applicants will be notified by email 2 months prior to the workshop.

Equal Opportunities

The application form requests the following information:

- 1) Applicant details
- 2) Brief CV: academic career, publications, markers of esteem, and any other relevant information (no more than half an A4 page)
- 3) Abstract: Please give a summary of your area of research (150 word limit)
- 4) Please describe your motivation for attending the workshop and how the workshop matches your professional development needs (150 word limit)
- 5) Please describe the expected impact of your participation on your personal and professional development, including your ability to work internationally (150 word limit)
- 6) Please indicate how you will disseminate the outcomes of the workshops and the new knowledge / skills you have acquired (150 word limit)
- 7) Please indicate your ability to work and communicate in English, ie: Native speaker / Good / Excellent / Need support (NB: Workshops will take place in English as standard and translators may be provided if necessary)
- 8) There will also be space to give any additional information that you feel is relevant for the application (150 word limit)
